The "One Board" Model, How We Got Here...

Recently we reviewed the process for shifting our church governance to the "one board" model in a meeting. It was suggested that I share this procedure with everyone.

As we have walked through the Transformation process with Dr. Gloria Fowler, one of her recommendations was turning to the "one board/simplified accountable board" model for ministry. At the June 12th Church Council meeting, Dr. Fowler made a presentation to the Church Council detailing the new board's responsibilities, how it is to be populated, and the process of gaining necessary permission to make this change.

- At the conclusion of her presentation, a motion was made and vote taken to make this change in governance.
- Permission then had to be granted by the district superintendent, and this was received by letter dated July 1, 2019.
- The Nominating Committee then began meeting. This committee read the book "Mission Possible". This book details the One Board/Simplified Accountable Board model. It was written by United Methodists for implementation in Methodist churches.
- The new board will consist of nine (9) members divided into three (3) classes 2020, 2021, & 2022. This staggering prevents complete turnover of the board ensuring continuity. The church's Lay Leader and two (2) Annual Conference delegates are also on the new board.

Be proud of your Nominating Committee: they spent hours in discussion and preparation, and have shared their expectations with persons they believe will make servant leaders for our church.

Once the nominations report is finalized, it will be voted upon by the Church Council on November 3rd. If there are any recomendations, this is when that occurs. The approved final report will then be formally ratified on November 19th at the Charge Conference.

The IMPACT of Generosity

It was after the harvest in the fall of the year when the farmers in the earliest Jewish and Christians traditions would offer a portion of their crops to the priests in appreciation for the provisions of land, water, sun, air, and seeds God had provided. The sacred practice has been carried forward to the modern church. In the fall of the year we consider the blessings God has given us and make a financial estimate of what we will give back to the work and people put before us through the church.


