



BUMC Governance Board: 1st Year Review

January 2020 began with the first meeting of Broadmoor's new Governance Board led by Chairperson, Amy Sudduth. The 4 previous committees: Church Council, SPR, Trustees and Finance were combined into one new Board, focused on the mission of Broadmoor: "Inspiring people to know, grow and go in God's love."

Life seemed simpler in February when we weren't focused on learning about Zoom meetings or the proper way to wear a mask. Instead, we were planning for upcoming events such as Connect Cards at the Ash Wednesday service and inviting others to our Palm Sunday and Easter services.

Unfortunately the COVID-19 health crisis caused the cancellation of many of our favorite events including weekly Sunday worship, Bible studies, Sunday school and hearing the Chancel Choir sing on Easter Sunday. The Governance Board voted to begin live streaming of Sunday worship on March 15. This would be without the congregation present.

The Paycheck Protection Plan (PPP) loan was approved and helped our church continue operating in this difficult time. Preliminary planning began for October's Generosity Campaign, "Shine On". Gifts and tithes for the month of May dropped and the Board worked with Rev. Terry Love to monitor church finances. We voted to temporarily stop the 8:30 service during the pandemic. We acknowledged the retirement of Broadmoor Buddies' Director Anne Cathcart after 40 years of service and we unanimously voted for

Broadmoor Buddies' teacher Stephanie Smith, to fill this position.

The Board discussed church re-opening guidelines and voted to hold the first in-house worship service on June 7. Masks and hand sanitizers were placed around the fellowship area. A few Sunday School classes, Bible studies and small groups resumed meeting in person, in September.

At the "State of the Church" meeting on July 26, information was shared with the congregation about the structure of the Governance Board, church finances, Board accomplishments and future plans. This meeting was also recorded and sent out in an email blast. A church conference was held August 9 and church members voted 45-3 to continue the One Board structure in 2021.

This year the Board voted to repair the HVAC system, the brick wall in our parking lot, and the furnace unit in Anderson Hall.

A proposed grant for pastoral internship was received and in August, Perkins School Of Theology student, Megan Twyman, began serving as pastoral intern at Broadmoor. We appreciate her help with the Congregational Care committee, our Kids Hope ministry, Advent boxes, and Angel Tree ministry, as well as rotational teaching in the Upper Room class and leading the upcoming *The Prodigal God* Bible study.

The Paycheck Protection Program (PPP)
Forgiveness application was submitted in
October. We have been notified that our PPP
loan was forgiven in full.

The Louisiana Annual Conference, normally held in June at the Shreveport Convention Center, was held this year in November via Zoom Video Conferencing. In her Episcopal Address, Bishop Cynthia Fierro Harvey told us that "even though 2020 has been a difficult year, our lives have been disrupted and it would be easy to lose our way, we are people of faith and hope. We believe the Lord has been with us and is with us now providing all that we need day after day."

As the Governance Board completes its first year of operation, we are so grateful for everything the pastors and staff of Broadmoor have done to guide our church through this difficult time. It's reassuring to be able to watch our weekly church service on the Broadmoor YouTube channel if we choose not to attend church in person.

The Board greatly appreciates the Mission team and the Ministry team for all the work they have accomplished this year, especially with the COVID-19 pandemic challenges.

Furthermore, we appreciate the support of all of you, our members and guests. Thank you for your prayers, your continued giving and your willingness to serve where needed.

May God continue leading all of us in 2021.




Meant For Good Book Study Sunday, Jan. 3rd from 5 - 6:30 PM

New Study: The Prodigal God

Pastoral Intern Megan Twyman will be leading a 7-week study on *The Prodigal God* by Timothy Keller beginning Tuesday, January 12, 2021 and ending on Tuesday, February 23, 2021. You can attend at 10 AM or 6 PM each Tuesday in Pearce Hall. The cost of this event is \$20 to cover the book and other materials.

Timothy Keller's The Prodigal God is an eye-opening account of the importance of the Christian faith for long-time Christians and new Christians alike. We will take a look at the Parable of the Prodigal Son. Keller claims, "The narrative is as much about the elder brother as the younger, and as much about the father as the sons. And what Jesus says about the older brother is one of the most important messages given to us in the Bible. The parable might be better called the *Two Lost Sons*.

This is an important claim because the father's welcome to the younger son was reckless because he refused to "reckon" or count his sin against the younger son or demand repayment. The father represented our Heavenly Father. Jesus shows us our Father is nothing if not prodigal toward us, His children. God's reckless grace is our greatest hope, a life-changing experience, and the subject of this book.
