A children's Sunday School teacher had a great idea for presenting the Easter message. In his class were six students including Phillip, who had Down's Syndrome. The teacher

brought in six extra-large plastic eggs. He gave one to each student and instructed them to go to the playground area and find something that represented new life.

The kids were thrilled, and they went running down the hallway and outdoors. Armed with their eggs they began scouring the churchyard for some special object that would speak to new life. When they were finished, they went back in the classroom.

There they gathered around as the teacher opened the eggs one-by-one in front of them. The first contained a butterfly wing – a worthy symbol of resurrection and new life. Another one held a bud, and the next one had a flower that had bloomed.

One was opened revealing a stone. The kids' responses were predictable. "That's so dumb. Who would put a stone in their egg?"

"I did," confessed little Maggie. "I knew you'd all put in buds and flowers and stuff. I wanted to put in something completely different because that's what new life means to me."

When the last egg was opened, it was completely empty. This time the kids really hooted. "Did somebody not get it?" "Did whatever was in there drop out of a hole?" And on and on.






