PASTOR'S MESSAGE Dr. Greg Davis, Senior Pastar

He Couldn't Make it any Clearer Every Act of Love Makes a Difference.

To be human is to have wounds. Everyone has them, even Jesus. Remember Thomas and Jesus? We don't talk about those wounds much – they're distasteful.

We are vulnerable. We don't choose the time we die, or even when we were born. Everyone reading this didn't get to choose his or her parents. We don't get to choose our genetic makeup.

We are dependent. We are dependent upon the earth for air, water and food. We are dependent on others for love and acceptance. We are dependent upon God for everything.

We don't like being dependent. We spend our lives trying not to be dependent upon anyone or anything. Thus we dream about winning the sweepstakes or accumulating enough money, real estate, stocks and bonds to prove that we are independent.

Then along comes cancer, unemployment, divorce, kids on drugs or arthritis in your spine. Suddenly, you hope there is a God, and that God notices you.

So many things around us. One look at the "world" through the news media lets us know things aren't right. Why do we do such things to each other? Why is life unfair? Is it possible that we are not okay? What really matters?

Every act of love makes a difference. Every act of faith is important. Every act of forgiveness matters. Every prayer helps move us forward.

Repeatedly, in the Upper Room, Jesus issues the command: love one another as I have loved you. He couldn't make it any clearer.

Every Sunday when you come to church you are admitting your dependence. Every Sunday we pray and sing. We bow our heads and confess. We ask for help. We let God's Word touch our lives. As part of the Transformation Process here at BUMC, we have a team called "Engagement". This team has been charged with setting the course and direction of outreach of our church into our community.

Now first of all, this is not to discount, discourage or dismantle ANY of our church's current Mission Activities, but instead to explore the community that we serve in the surrounding Broadmoor Neighborhood and the Shreveport Bossier area, and find how our church can be more engaged with our neighbors.

In order to do this in a logical way this team has identified 16 community leaders to be "interviewed" about their thoughts on what they view as the most pressing needs of our community and potential ways our church can address those issues and thus, improve life in our community.

We have developed a list of 8 key questions we will be taking to these leaders over the month of April. We will then gather to sort through this information and make recommendations of very specific programs that our church should consider.

Engagement, along with all the other teams working on transformation will help lead our church with new ideas in a comprehensive plan for our church to move forward, reach others in our community and make a positive, meaningful impact where we live.
