Since the 300s, Christians have observed Lent as a time of preparation, even a spring cleaning of the soul. During these 40 days, starting with Ash Wednesday, we imitate Jesus' withdrawal into the Wilderness. Lent is a time for evaluating ourselves in light of God's Word, abandoning sin, and receiving God's forgiveness and power. These 40 days provide the opportunity to refocus our lives on God. It can be a 40 day trial run for changing our lifestyle and letting God change our hearts.

This year, why not pick up something for Lent? Collect food for the needy, place it in a Red Bag you can get at the church. Volunteer to teach Children's Sunday School. Support our volunteers at Arthur Circle Elementary. Lead a Bible Study at the Juvenile Detention Center. Help Roy's Kids. Commit yourself to help a different stranger, co-worker, neighbor, or friend daily. Serving others is one way we serve God.

Join us for worship: during Lent we'll be talking about "Finding Jesus" in worship as we ask God to change our hearts during the season of Lent.

Our Transformation Process teams have been meeting. We are moving forward with the common goal of how we can best lead people to know Jesus Christ, to grow in discipleship and to go in service to our community and beyond.

Our Visioning Team met with Dr. Fowler and is working on our mission, our vision and our value statements. Our Discipleship Team also met with Dr. Fowler and we began to think about what our Discipleship path will be. We also discussed new ways to help our first time guests get connected.

Our Hospitality Team has read the book, Fusion, Turning First-Time Guests Into Fully Engaged Members of Your Church. The book reminded us that each guest that comes through our doors on Sunday morning is a gift from God. And that everything speaks to first-time guests, including the condition of our building, our signs, and how someone is greeted. We are working on a well-planned, well-executed assimilation system that we can put into place to ensure that first-time guests, who come to Broadmoor are transformed into fully developing followers of Jesus Christ. One of the things you can

look forward to hearing about is our new "Connect Card". Instead of signing in on the pew pads we will be moving to a card that will enable you to sign in, ask a question, sign up for a class and share a pray request.

Our Engagement Team met for the first time and they are reading the book, The Externally Focused Church. This team is tasked with going out into the neighborhood, the surrounding businesses and talking with community leaders about what the needs are in our area. They will then decide on one need that can be a signature mission of our church.

Prayer is the foundation of all we are doing. Amy Watts and our Prayer Team continue to hold our members and our church in prayer during this process. Just How Much More Is Needed To Complete The Bold Campaign?

As of March 4, the balance of the indebtedness of BUMC at the bank is \$799,970. Deduct \$75,000 of pledges remaining to be paid and \$136,000 in reserves, and the adjusted balance is \$588,970.

If we put that adjusted balance in context of the total gifts, \$2,901,378.16, already received since the beginning of the BOLD Campaign, we are in need of a final 20% to successfully complete the campaign. In other words, if all who have given a gift to the campaign would give an additional 20%, the campaign would be finished!

Of course, some may not be able to give an additional amount, but maybe others can give more than an additional 20%. Perhaps you have been waiting to the end of the campaign to see if the debt can really be paid off. It appears it can with your assistance. The time is now to step forward and help with the final 20%.

Ask God to guide your generosity as we draw closer to the end of the Campaign on May 31, 2019. Thank you for all the prayers and generous gifts you offer to support BUMC!



Video Study & Discussion | C.S. Lewis' book, Mere Christianity | Sunday, March 10th | Searcher's class

One of the most influential intellectual Christians, C.S. Lewis, a former atheist taught at Oxford University from 1922 to 1954. During WW II, he was invited by the BBC to give a series of radio talks entitled, The Christian Faith as I See It - by a Layman. These talks were to be inspirational to the British people and to the troops engaged in the war effort.

From these, talks Lewis then wrote his Mere Christianity which expanded on his 5 fifteen-minute talks which broadcast beginning on August 6, 1941. Mere Christianity was voted best book of the twentieth century by Christianity Today in 2000.
