Streamlining - the Simplified, Accountable Board System

This is the first in a series of articles about BUMC's streamlining of decision-making. There will be change in church governance that will take effect January 2020. Led by consultant Gloria Fowler, the church council – with about 30 others in attendance – voted to move to a simplified, accountable board system.

The nominations committee will be meeting the first Sunday in August. Beginning with prayer and guided by the Holy Spirit, they will begin the task of simplifying the governance structure. Through 2019, BUMC has had four committees – church council, staff-parish (personnel), trustees, and finance. Each committee met and operated separately

In the new model – the simplified accountable structure – there are NOT four separate committees, meetings and areas of responsibility. Instead, the entire new board will be responsible for all four areas. It is more in line with non-profit governance. It is comprehensive – rather than looking at an issue only through the lens of finance, the board can widen the lens and approach the issue or decision through the lens of trustees, staff-parish, finance, and the overall church.

It's like having four hats on the table during meetings. One is council, one is staff-parish, one is trustees, one is finance. When the topic of facilities is on the agenda, everyone puts on their trustees hat; then, when stewardship or budgetary issues are on the agenda, the trustees hats come off and the finance hats are put on.

In other words, every person on the board has all responsibilities in all areas.

Here's information about the simplified board: it will consist of three terms, or classes: 2020, 2021, 2022. In addition, the Lay Leader and Lay Delegates to Annual Conference will be on the board. So we are talking 12 persons involved in church governance.





One child, one hour is the heart of **KIDS HOPE USA**. Kids Hope is one caring adult, mentoring an at-risk child, one hour, every week. But one church, one school is its brilliance.

Broadmoor United Methodist and Kids Hope is starting its thirteenth year with Arthur Circle. Volunteers are matched with one child, trained on ways to help him or her with reading, math, and social skills.



Many of these children live below the poverty level and many have family members who are incarcerated, abuse drugs, or emotionally challenged. Studies show that young children who are exposed to caring relationships that offer hope, have a much better chance for success than their peers who are not given this opportunity. Won't you help us give hope to a precious child in dire need of hope? There are no specific skills needed...just a willing spirit.

How can you get involved:

Kids Hope is in need of prayer partners, readers, teacher encouragers, Friday friends, substitute mentors, library helpers and Kids Hope Angels. Each of these volunteer opportunities are vital to our service to the Kids Hope program. New this year, we are asking for families to adopt a teacher. There are so many ways we can help our adopted school.
