WHY DO WE WORRY?

There are basically three reasons. Number one, we don't know the future. We don't know what is going to happen. We don't know how things will turn out, and we don't know what will or will not work. And too often we imagine the worst rather than hope for the best.

A second reason we worry is because we can't solve all our problems. If it were something we could fix or change, we could get busy fixing or changing it. But we often face problems that are bigger than we are. We don't have the necessary skills or resources, and so we worry. Now our worrying doesn't make things any better. In fact, it only makes things worse. But we are worriers, so we go ahead and worry anyways.

A third reason we worry is because we can't be everywhere at once. Our children are away at school, and we can't be there with them, so we worry. Our loved ones live in other towns. Or here's a big one. We worry about what will happen to our loved ones if we die. Why? Because if we're dead, we can no longer be there with them.

Here are three antidotes to worry. First, trust in God. 1 Peter 5 tells us: "Cast all your anxiety on him because he cares for you." Jesus said, "Do not let your hearts be troubled. Believe in God; believe also in me...do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid." We need to trust him God with our circumstances. We worry because we're finite; God is way more than that. Entrust your worries to God.

Also, we need to live in the present. Long ago Cynthia and I memorized the verse, "Therefore do not be anxious about tomorrow, for tomorrow will be anxious for itself; let the day's own troubles be sufficient for the day." We worry about so many things that never come true. Let go of the past, and remember the future's not here yet. Work on what you can today

And of course, pray. "Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God" (Philippians 4:6).


