# The Simplified, Accountable Board System | Part 3

This is the third in a series concerning BUMC's streamlining of governance. 2020 will see the change in how decisions are made. It involves reducing the number of elected positions and streamlining the decision-making process. The Nominating Committee is presently studying this simplified structure in depth.

It revolves around the reason – the basic, fundamental, most important reason – the church exists: to make disciples for Jesus Christ. So, here's a question I've asked regarding changing to a Simplified, Accountable Board: WHY?

- To be more efficient. So that leaders can lead, not simply maintain the status quo. To move towards a permission-giving culture...with fewer meetings. And to free up more committed leaders for doing actual ministry, not sitting on boards and committees.
- To be more accountable. Let's face it, it's impossible to hold a board responsible. In other words, when "everyone" is responsible, no one is actually held responsible. This structure calls upon each leader to be accountable and responsible – to God, to themselves, to others serving on the board, as well as the congregation.
- Because we're at a good point. BUMC is blessed not having issues of mistrust or power-grabbing cliques.
- To be more intentional about holding up the mission and vision of the church regarding everything we do.

Simplifying our governance structure is about making the church's decision-making much faster and having more lay leadership involved in process of disciple-making here that involves knowing, growing and going into the world. It moves past simply reporting what has already happened to focus upon what needs to happen for ministry and mission to occur.

#### Join THE BEYOND BOLD Brigade


