The Simplified, Accountable Board System | Part 2

This is the second in a series of articles about BUMC's streamlining of decision-making. There will be change in church governance that will take effect January 2020. Led by consultant Gloria Fowler, the church council – with about 30 others in attendance – voted to move to a simplified accountable board system.

Leadership Board Purpose

- The board is accountable to Jesus Christ to guide the congregation in making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world
- Use a leadership style that combines accountability, responsibility, and authority
- Reduce micro-management
- Align all BUMC's ministries with the mission, vision, and goals
- Reduce the number of people engaged in administration/ governance and free up resources (time, talents, gifts, etc.) for hands-on ministry in the mission field
- Empower the pastor to lead

Leadership Board Responsibilities

- Confirm the vision cast by the pastor and establish annual and long-term goals for BUMC
- Work in partnership with programs and ministries
- Ensure ministries and teams fulfill the mission and vision of BUMC
- Work with the District Superintendent to hold the pastor accountable

Pastor's Role

- Cast the vision
- Hire, supervise, assess (and if needed, terminate) both paid and unpaid staff
- Hold staff (paid and unpaid) accountable for leading their ministry greas
- Hold staff (paid and unpaid) accountable to fulfilling the mission and vision of BUMC
- Monitor the accomplishment of church goals make adjustments as required to ensure achievement of the goals

Accountability to the mission and vision is crucial. BUMC's mission is to inspire people to know, grow and go in God's love.

■ BACK TO SCHOOL SUNDAY!


We hope you will join us this Sunday, August 11th as we celebrate all those students, teachers, administrators, and guardians for our Back to School Sunday in all three services!

One child, one hour is the heart of **KIDS HOPE USA**. Kids Hope is one caring adult, mentoring an at-risk child, one hour, every week. But one church, one school is its brilliance.

Broadmoor United Methodist and Kids Hope is starting its thirteenth year with Arthur Circle. Volunteers are matched with one child, trained on ways to help him or her with reading, math, and social skills.





Many of these children live below the poverty level and many have family members who are incarcerated, abuse drugs, or emotionally challenged. Studies show that young children who are exposed to caring relationships that offer hope, have a much better chance for success than their peers who are not given this opportunity. Won't you help us give hope to a precious child in dire need of hope? There are no specific skills needed...just a willing spirit.

How can you get involved:

Kids Hope is in need of prayer partners, readers, teacher encouragers, Friday friends, substitute mentors, library helpers and Kids Hope Angels. Each of these volunteer opportunities are vital to our service to the Kids Hope program. New this year, we are asking for families to adopt a teacher. There are so many ways we can help our adopted school.
