

A little girl and her mother from Providence House showed up a few weeks ago to start school at Arthur Circle. The mother did not have the funds to buy school supplies and the child looked very upset when this came up. The receptionist told them not to worry and went to the school supplies we had collected and got all the supplies the child needed. The little girl started smiling real big and said "I like this school; this is going to be the best place I have ever been."




BAKE THEM, BRING THEM, AND BUY THEM! | NOVEMBER 18th

Led by Dr. Greg Davis and Rev. Kelly Berne | Begins November 28th & 29th


