A RESPONSE TO GRACE

Richard Halverson said. "There's an intimate correlation between the development of a person's character and how he or she handles money."

Take Zaccheus, an old crook in the Bible.

One day, Zaccheus heard Jesus was passing through, so he climbed a tree in order to see lesus. When people saw Zaccheus in the tree, they were sure Jesus would have harsh words for him. They probably licked their chops as they saw Jesus stop, call Zaccheus down from the tree, and begin speaking to him. Can't you imagine it? "That crook is finally going to get what he deserves!" "lesus will show him!

Instead of condemning him, though, Jesus offered him the intimacy of table fellowship – a high honor in Middle Eastern culture. Sharing a meal was a sign of friendship. The biblical account does not mention Jesus criticizing Zaccheus. Instead, Jesus dealt with him in gracious love.

Zaccheus' response tells it all: he'd never experienced unconditional love! That moment Zaccheus felt valued and was taken seriously as a human being, he began to change. He was overwhelmed by a moment of grace.

He freely responded to God's grace by getting his life back in order. He began to live as a person of integrity. He decided to pay back the people he'd cheated and he opened his eys, heart, and wallet to the poor. Zaccheus' spending and use of money was never the same again.

Whenever someone experiences grace and truly understands what it means to be loved, cherished, and forgiven by God, he or she becomes a new creation. One's spending of time and dollars begins to reflect the value system of Jesus Christ. One's entire life becomes a response to grace.

We discover that the only reason for giving is gratitude.

Study the OUTPOURING logo above where a number of the blessings through which God works at BUMC are emphasized. Perhaps it will give you some ideas about God's gifts for your list.





\$978,000 Loan Principal Balance

As I was reading from Renovate or Die, the accompanying book for our present transformation process, I came across the following section title,

URGENCY, VISION, AND REALITY WITH HOPE.

It struck me that these were the elements the Stewardship Committee acknowledged and acted upon when they laid out the BOLD Faithful Campaign to pay off the indebtedness of BUMC in 48 months.

URGENCY – there was a lot of debt, \$ 3.3 M scheduled to be paid over twenty years that would incur \$ 1.7 M in interest. There are also a lot of other places in the ministry of the church that need funding over the next twenty years.

VISION – pay off the debt as soon as possible.

REALITY WITH HOPE – when it was proposed to have a 48 month campaign to pay off the debt completely, there was the blind cheerleader enthusiasm of "we can do this" pressed up against the imposingly large mountain of \$3.3 M. Even against all the obvious obstacles, the SPIRIT was moving. The real consensus with the Stewardship, Finance and Trustees committees and Administrative Council was: Let's give this our best shot, and with hope in God's help, what we do will be blessed and be right for the future of the church. GOD IS GOOD and the debt now stands at \$ 978,000 with about \$200,000 in pledges outstanding.

So many have given so much, and we are all so grateful. You can see, however, that we still need your additional gifts in the next eight months to complete this work that God is doing here.

Please keep praying and trusting your hope in God's guidance to give what you can to finish the BOLD Campaign.
