



Pastor's Message Rev. Kelly Berne, Executive Pastor

"As for me and my house...we will serve the Lord." Joshua 24:14-15

If you knew that tomorrow the world would go to pieces, would you still plant a tree? It is something for us to consider as we continue to focus this month on our sermon series and generosity campaign, "What Disciples Do with Their Church Membership." In his lectionary reflections for September 29, 2013, Bruce Epperly wrote, "Faithful stewardship is about planting trees of possibility and acting in light of a hope-for future."
