Pastor's Message

Festival de Noel was just what the doctor ordered. Beautiful, inspiring music filled the sanctuary. People were so happy to be there, and many returned for the first time in a long time. It was a joyous and fitting beginning to the season of Advent, which will end with Christmas Eve. Thank you, Adam and Choir, for setting the stage.

By the time you read this, there will have been a charge conference held on Dec. 2nd. The purpose of it was to authorize the Trustees (in BUMC's case, the Governance Board) to vote at a future date on the Boy Scouts of America (BSA) bankruptcy settlement. The motion carried. The Governance Board will vote on the settlement as recommended by the conference legal team.

The attorney (called the Chancellor) counseling the Annual Conference of the UMC in Louisiana said each church that has had a Troop charter at any point in the past needed to take this vote to direct the Trustees (in BUMC's case, the Governance Board) to vote as representatives of each church. The BSA is facing lawsuits over past abuse claims, and there is a question of whether BSA's insurance covered chartering organizations. All of this legal maneuvering stems from this question. We should know more about this in January; at this point, all we can do is await news from the Chancellor.





We had a wonderfully successful kick off to the Advent season with our annual Festival de Noël! Thank you to everyone who helped make it happen. Stephanie Master and her team worked hard to get the space decorated and looking great. Mary Fisher and her team of ushers and Whitney Gates and the greeters helped make everyone feel welcome that evening. Nancy Beauvais and the Searchers Class provided a wonderful reception following the program. David O'Quinn and Micheal Johnston went above and beyond to help transition the sanctuary multiple times moving the pulpit and lectern and bringing chairs and stands and more things than any of us know about. Thank you to our wonderfully generous patrons who help make this happen every year. Thank you to the congregation's support of the music ministry and of this wonderful event. I look forward to Festival de Noël 2022!
