New Beginnings 2023

In our worship on January 1, 2023 at Broadmoor United Methodist Church, Shreveport (BUMC) we concluded our service singing the hymn "This Is a Day of New Beginnings." The writer of this hymn, Brian Wren bases its words on the scripture text of Revelation 21:5 (... "see, I am making all things new." Also, he said, "Write this, for these words are trustworthy and true."). Some of the lyrics of this great hymn include verse 1: "This is a day of new beginnings, time to remember and move on, time to believe what love is bringing, laying to rest the pain that's gone." and verse 3: "Then let us, with the Spirit's daring, step from the past and leave behind our disappointment, guilt, and grieving, seeking new paths, and sure to find."

On the first Sunday of 2023 we also prayed the Wesleyan Covenant Prayer which was adapted by John Wesley, the co-founder of Methodism (along with his brother, Charles) for the renewal of the believer's covenant with God. Wesley says that the prayer was first used in a covenant renewal service held on Monday, August 11, 1755, in London, with 1800 people present. Since then, the Wesleyan Covenant Prayer has often been used in Methodist services around the world on the first Sunday of the year.

This prayer points to deep surrender of ourselves in complete trust to God. At first use, the words of the prayer can be jarring. I invite you to pray these words with me until you mean them.

> I am no longer my own, but thine. Put me to what thou wilt, rank me with whom thou wilt. Put me to doing, put me to suffering. Let me be employed for thee or laid aside for thee, exalted for thee or brought low for thee. Let me be full, let me be empty. Let me have all things, let me have nothing. I freely and heartily yield all things to thy pleasure and disposal. And now, O glorious and blessed God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, thou art mine, and I am thine.

So be it.

And the covenant which I have made on earth, let it be ratified in heaven. Amen.

Each day is an opportunity for new beginnings; an opportunity for God to make new in us. As we are beginning a new year of ministry and mission at BUMC I pray we will join in seeking the wholeness of God's love, mercy, grace and forgiveness for ourselves and welcome such for others as we model what it means to Know, Grow, and Go in God's love.

Governance Board Message

The monthly BUMC Governance Board meeting was held on Sunday, December 18, 2022, at 4:00 p.m. in Pearce Hall. These items of business were discussed:

Kenny Beauvais updated the Board on the "Methodist issue" about the future of the UMC and our personal direction for the future as this appears to be a concern for some in our BUMC family. Please refer to the Governance Board Message in The Messenger (December 8, 2022). An email (governance@broadmoorumc.org) was established so all specific questions could be directed to the Governance Board sub-committee. Questions could also be mailed to the church. As of December 18, 2022, five questions had been received.

Rev. Terry Love reported on our revenue status through November 2022. BUMC remains in good financial condition. He talked about the faithfulness of the BUMC members during a difficult time. It was anticipated that end of year commitments and First Gifts would end our year in a positive place. Discussion on needed Elevator Repair and Maintenance was continued to January as additional information was requested. Our upgrading to fiber optic internet service is now complete. He shared that he is retiring in March 2023. He has been a wonderful financial leader for our church as we were able to pay off the Church's outstanding debt in 2022 for prior renovations. As we wish him much joy in his retirement, please pray for the Governance Board Task Force who will be seeking God's choice for our church in the days ahead.

How blessed we are as part of The Church, but also as part of Broadmoor United Methodist Church/Shreveport. Each one of us plays an important role in inspiring people to Know, Grow, and Go in God's love!
