The Governance Board had a meeting on Sunday, January 21st where we thanked our out-going members and welcomed some new faces to the board. The new Governance Board members include Michael Hochstetler, Jane Hubbard, and Robert Taylor. Janet Fowler is a new conference delegate. Steve Lindsey was also in attendance as BUMC's Assistant Lay Leader.

The meeting opened with a review of the December meeting minutes, which passed with a unanimous vote. Year-end financials were the next topic of business, and it was reported that 2023 ended with a \$55,000 shortfall. The shortfall was due, in part, to a \$116,000 decrease in revenue from what was projected in the 2023 budget. It was noted that 139 pledge cards for 2024 have been received to date, with pledges totaling \$665,100.

Governance Board Chairman David Simon announced the formation of a budget taskforce is looking at ways to further reduce expenses, increase revenues and complete a balanced budget for 2024. At present, the estimated budget shortfall is \$105,000. The task force also recommended an additional appeal to the congregation with the current budget information. Please be on the look-out in the coming weeks for additional information.

At the end of the Governance Board, meeting a vote was held to elect a Chairperson and a Vice Chairperson. David Simon was nominated to continue as Chairperson, and the motion caried. Michael Hochstetler was nominated to serve as Vice-Chairperson and the motion carried.



There are many opportunities to join United Women in Faith, so come join our community of Faith!


