



Pastor's Message Dr. Greg Davis, Senior Pastor

There's nothing more enjoyable than an Easter dinner. A friend of mine described the highlight of Easter for her: visiting her grandmother's house in the country. The aroma of rich food greeted her every Easter when she'd walk up the back porch: ham, greens, creamed corn, and hopefully iron skillet cornbread.

Susan always prayed for cornbread because the one thing her grandmother couldn't make was biscuits. Seems she didn't believe in baking powder. When she pulled those biscuits out of the oven, they looked like brown catheads. Susan's uncle joked that if you dropped one on the floor it'd wake the dead!

Thus their nickname: Resurrection Biscuits.

Every Easter Susan fondly recalls her grandmother and those Resurrection Biscuits. She told me she thought her grandmother's biscuits contained an important Easter message. Without baking powder—without that key ingredient—those biscuits became heavy and hard. So, too, life without the resurrection, life without Christ, can be flat and hard.

For everyone out there who feels that their dreams are broken, their hopes dashed, their spirits crushed...here is the good news of Easter morning: The risen Christ can take our heavy, hardened hearts and add that key ingredient...

- ...so that our spirits are not stuck in the ground,
- ...so that our spirits are not dictated by human pain or loss or disappointment,
- ...so that our spirits are not mired in a tomb.

Easter brings each of us a second chance...to see the life force in our midst...to recognize the risen Christ right in front of us...a chance to start again.

As the Governance Board welcomes the spring and Holy Week, I want to again thank Gay Gaskins for the great example she set by agreeing to serve as the Chairperson of the Board for the coming year. The board and the church can move forward with confidence following her lead and knowing that we are in good hands.

I would like to share with you some of the things that have been going on with your Governance Board. During our most recent meeting we approved the development of a committee to do an evaluation of the various kitchen facilities on the church grounds and provide a recommendation for improvements. This to better serve the needs of the church and allow for continued, wonderful Methodist get-togethers like the Debt Retirement Celebration and more evangelism related events in the future.

During that same meeting the board reviewed and approved two very needed expenditures. First, a request to replace the roof covering the overhang at the sanctuary doors. Second, the replacement of an obsolete Sanctuary lighting control system. This lighting system replacement includes an upgrade of the dimmer cabinet, the control board in the balcony, and the replacement of the most prominent theatrical light fixtures that illuminate the chancel area.

On Maundy Thursday we remembered the Last Supper where Jesus gave his disciples the blessed and broken bread (his body), and after giving thanks, the cup (his blood of the new covenant), please know that the members of the board prayerfully seek direction prior to and during the actions of the board meetings. Our goal is to continue our charge to help ourselves and others to Know, Go and Grow in God's Love.

Paint Your Heart Out Shreveport is one of the City of Shreveport's premier programs administered by the Department of Community Development, Bureau of Housing & Business Development.

It is an annual paint program where homeowners 62 or older, and/or disabled, can qualify to have their homes painted free of charge. Over 1,000 volunteers from several organizations come together on one day each year to complete this dynamic task.


