DON'T YOU WISH WE COULD CRY UNCLE ABOUT NOW?

Back when I was a kid, my brother and I would wrestle. He was older and larger, and whenever he got me in an especially painful position, I could yell - or groan - UNCLE! And that was enough, he'd relent.

Don't you wish we could cry UNCLE about now? We just want God to relent. We want to put this interruption of our lives behind us. But there are so many "known unknowns" and the dreaded "unknown unknowns" that it's unclear what the timetable to normality looks like.

That uncertainty weighs on our hearts. It seems people fall into one of two categories: impatience or weariness.

The Psalmist sang it and the Prophet complained about it. The problem of time. Our impatience with time. Our frustration with time. Our desire for time to flow the way we desire it to flow.

And, underneath, our impatience with God. We've cried UNCLE! Shouldn't that be enough? "How long, O Lord? Will you forget me forever?" complains the Psalmist in the 13th Psalm. Then there's the Prophet Habakkuk. Evidently, he felt the same frustration we are feeling today: "O Lord, how long shall I cry for help, and you will not listen?"

It's like our cries of UNCLE! are falling on deaf ears - or God's not there. And

that's when we find ourselves alongside the Psalmist, the Prophet, and even Jesus upon the Cross.

Look, the absence of God is a major theme of scripture and a common struggle in the Christian life. If you call yourself a Christian and haven't struggled with God's seeming silence and absence, well, you will.

Here's the thing: the Psalmist and the Prophet cry their impatience directly toward the face of God. Their experience of the absence of God is not enough to make them deny the presence of the God in whom they trust.

There's a poem that speaks volumes about God's absence. About our impatience with God's timing. It was written during WW2, on the wall of a cellar, by a Jew in the Cologne concentration camp.

I believe in the sun
even when it is not shining
And I believe in love,
even when there's no one there.
And I believe in God,
even when he is silent.

Believe. Express yourself to God. Love.
