From the Governance Board:

The Governance Board meeting was held on Sunday, April 16, 2023 at 4:00 P.M. in Pearce Hall. These items of business were discussed:

The Board approved moving the church pictorial directory to Realm, a virtual application, which is also a communication site and a way to keep in touch with your areas of ministry. Announcements will be placed in the Messenger, as well as an e-blast to be sent on April 27 and May 11. Instructions for use will be included in the communications.

Reapproval for the Governance Board Model will be held after the 11:00 service on May 21, 2023. The congregation will have the opportunity to vote to keep the current Board Model or to return the Church Council Model.

The Board approved installation of window tinting in the Sanctuary/Fellowship areas, the Music Suite, and the Upper Room Classroom. The tinting should reduce heating costs by 60%, and allow 10-15% savings on cooling costs. Installation is planned for July. The project will be funded through the Jess Merkle Foundation, with a total cost of about \$28,000.

Replacement of the carpet in the administration and childcare areas was discussed. The project will be funded through the Jess Merkle Foundation, with a cost of \$18,000.

Giving in April was strong, compared to a decline in giving for February and March. Spending is slightly higher, with cost increases in office supplies, utilities, and personnel insurance.

Announcement was made that Rev. Kelly Berne will resign on May 31, 2023 to pursue a Doctorate in Leadership at LSU-S. We wish Kelly the best of everything as she takes this giant step into her future. Decisions will need to be made to realign job responsibilities of the pastors, with the potential to seek a part-time pastor.

The next Governance Board meeting will be on Sunday, May 21, 2023 at 4:00 P.M. on Pearce Hall.

Renesting Project is a community furniture bank whose mission is to collect and provide reclaimed furniture and household goods to those in need in our community.

Most notably, Renesting helps furnish homes for clients who are getting their first home after experiencing homelessness. Not only do they provide furniture, but also other basic necessities like kitchen and bathroom items.

History of Nanih Chito

Nanih Chito United Methodist church is in Wright City, Oklahoma. Nanih Chito is a Choctaw word that means Big Hill. Many Choctaw people attended this church through the many years gone by. The exact date of the church origin is not known, however, the trustees of Nanih Chito bought about 15 acres in 1912. Therefore, it has been around at least 121 years.

At the time of purchasing the land the Church was called Nanih Chito Methodist Episcopal Church. It later joined the Oklahoma Indian Missionary Conference (OIMC) which is headquartered in Oklahoma City, and it is now called Nanih Chito United Methodist Church.

The old small original church was torn down after the current church was built in 1966 by the local members of Nanih Chito, and currently has a small membership of older individuals. It is in a rural area about five miles east of Wright City, and the property is just beautiful! They do not have a pastor, but are supplied Lay speakers from the surrounding communities.

Members are Choctaw, and so many of the songs are sung in the native language. Many of the members speak the native language. The members range from little children (many are grandchildren) to Elders. Though the congregation is small, but its members love to worship God and the Lord Jesus Christ. Most have grown up in this church.

We have heard blessings in Choctaw which are beautiful. Solomon Tonihka and his grandchildren have sung the most beautiful, soul touching music to several of us as our work team got ready to leave. They are a resilient group who are always looking for new members or returning members to worship the Lord on Sunday mornings. Most of them grew up in the church and have wonderful memories of special times.


