
### **FIFTH GRADERS!**

### **UMW LEGISLATIVE DAY**

On April 14, UMW members from 40 states met with their state legislators to present the UMW position on Climate Justice, a priority issue specifically focused on how to invest in our nation's infrastructure and future. UMW is seeking Climate Justice by promoting use of renewable energy resources and decreasing dependence on fossil fuels, by promoting clean transportation through a shift to zero-emission vehicles and increased safe and accessible public transportation and by promoting a fair, equitable and just transition to these changes through the education, training and support of workers and communities currently dependent on the fossil fuel industries.

The Louisiana team was comprised of 5 members, all from Broadmoor UMC. Diane Valentine, Hilda Holder, Allison Wray, Mary Virginia Taylor and Sue Ottesen had Zoom meetings with aides from the offices of Representative Mike Johnson and Senators Bill Cassidy and John Kennedy. Each session lasted about 40 minutes and our team found the aides to be interested and receptive to what was presented. There were good give-and-take discussions with questions and answers. We found that there is already much work going on at a state and national level concerning renewable energy in Louisiana and all agreed this is a challenging transition for a state like ours with so many investments in the oil and gas industries.

Members of Broadmoor UMW are continuing their education and awareness of these issues through monthly Climate Justice webinars conducted by the UMW Just Energy for All campaign.
