CHURCH DEBT UNDER \$80,000!

How amazing the response has been to pay off the debt of the BUMC. In May, 2015, we kicked off the BOLD Faithful Campaign to eliminate \$3.3 Million of debt.

The remaining net balance due is \$79,607!

For each of you who have contributed to the BOLD Campaign, thank you very much. This effort has been a marathon for us all. Gifts small and large have all been significant in reducing the debt by \$3,220,000 in six years. You are to be commended in your faithfulness and commitment to this substantial task.

We are now so close to the finish line on this ambitious undertaking and would very much like to cross this threshold before the end of the year. Any additional gifts you would be willing to make will help tremendously in accomplishing this goal.

God continues to bless us in such mighty ways. We give thanks for God's constant generosity and grace that lifts us up and supports us in all we do.

WHEELCHAIR RAMP MINISTRY

FUMC Bossier has been building ramps for 10 years. When they first started, it was just a few a year, but this year they are on track to build as many as twenty. Due to the rising costs of lumber, financing this ministry has become expensive. Many of the people who require a wheelchair ramp don't have the means to purchase the materials, which is why FUMC Bossier always strives to build these ramps free of cost to the homeowner.

HOW WE CAN HELP!

1. YOU CAN HELP WITH YOUR PRAYERS

Prayers are needed for their ministry, the volunteers, and most of all the ramp recipients and their families.

2. YOU CAN HELP WITH YOUR SERVICE

Become a volunteer. No experience is needed. It's a learning process and we all learn something new with each build.

3. YOU CAN HELP WITH YOUR GIFTS

This is an expensive ministry. Ramps are built out of treated lumber and decking screws. A linear foot of a ramp costs

approximately \$30. A common 30-foot ramp will cost over \$1,000.

Our Missions Team will be outside the Sanctuary and River worship spaces each Sunday in June to collect donations and give you information on volunteering.
