May Governance Board Meeting Highlights

- **MAY 16TH CHURCH CONFERENCE:** Members voted to continue the Governance Board structure in 2022.
- **MAY 16TH CHARGE CONFERENCE:** The Governance Board voted to approve the change of Rev. Kelly Berne moving from her full-time position to 3/4 time. She will continue to provide Broadmoor with her excellent service.
REVIEW OF FINANCIALS: Expenses were down for the month of April and giving was up.
- The **GOVERNANCE BOARD** voted to approve a new policy on Designated/Restricted gifts.
- **JUNE MISSION FOCUS:** FUMC Bossier Wheelchair Ramp Ministry - FUMC-B provides wheelchair ramps to qualified individuals at no cost to the individual and has invited other churches to support their ministry with funding and volunteers.

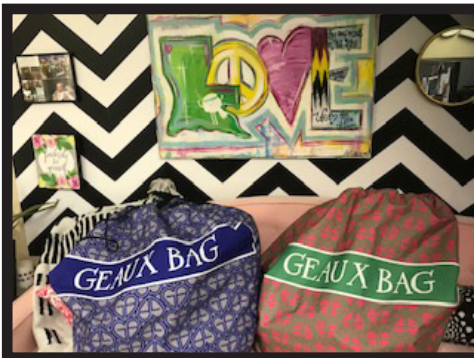


Rocky Railway Vacation Bible School | July 12th - 15th

ORGAN UPDATE | Adam Philley

If you have been to a service in the sanctuary over the past few months you may have noticed a lack of use of the organ. This is due to some repairs that are taking place. Our organ is about 20 years old and has reached the point where repairs are going to become more frequent. Our organ is a hybrid instrument meaning it is half electronic and half acoustic (pipe). One of the power supplies is glitching which has been causing a very loud noise to happen without warning. Also, one of the swell box's (a device that covers and uncovers the pipes allowing for some dynamic changes) motors was inoperable. Both of these issues are being worked on by a gentleman out of Jefferson, TX. Currently we are waiting on parts to arrive and then for installation. We thank you for your understanding and we all look forward to the return of the organ!
