## **Practicing the Presence of People**

"The chest pendant should be held in place by a blue cord binding its rings to the vest's rings so that the chest pendant rests on the vest's belt and won't come loose from the vest. 29 In this way, Aaron will carry the names of Israel's sons on the chest pendant for making decisions over his heart when he goes into the sanctuary as a reminder before the Lord at all times."

Exodus 28: 28-29 (CEB)

I wonder how often we stop to ask ourselves, "What is best for our people?" Aaron had this challenge every time he wore his priestly clothes, especially his breastplate. If we acted as Aaron, and kept on our hearts what is best for our people, how would that impact the decisions we make?

"What is best for our people?" is the question that your leadership has faced in reopening the building and offering in person worship again at Broadmoor. The decisions that have been made to move forward have not been made lightly. Ultimately, leadership is not just about vision and strategy, it's about people. And being in leadership is about having the heart of a shepherd.

Paul wrote to the people of Philippi, "It is right that I should feel as I do about all of you, for you have a very special place in my heart." That statement rings so true, right now more than ever, in my heart for each of you. It is that exact statement that has guided us in how to move forward, reopen the building, and practice worshiping together as a community again.

As we begin to move forward, knowing that things will be different, that worship will be different, I challenge you to ask yourself, "What is best for our people?"
