#### LA ANNUAL CONFERENCE OF THE UMC

As first-time delegates, we can say the LA Annual Conference was an eye-opener for us. With all the singing, fellowship, speeches/reports from committees, guest speaker, exhibit tables of information and selling of goods, it was infectious with enthusiasm during the 3 days that we attended.

Bishop Williamston addressed the session with her upbeat attitude, and military boots, and showed off her precious pup. She is a person who serves our God with so much energy and enthusiasm. Our theme was "HOPE" and we referenced the scripture of the paralyzed man being lowered on his mat to find Jesus, who forgave him of his sins and told him to take his mat and walk. The bishop told us that we are to roll up our mats and march forward in the UMC beyond our church walls and into our communities with a message of "HOPE" in making disciples for Jesus Christ in the days ahead. We'll have some challenges ahead, but God is with us-- we will get to where we need to be. Roughly 280 churches are staying in the UMC Louisiana; it is time for healing of our wounds with our vision of "HOPE".

Per Kenny Beauvais, Chair of LA Conference financial address Finance and Administration, we will NOT increase the apportionment budget ahead of local churches through 2024. This was unanimously approved. "Disaffiliation" funds of those exiting the conference will be used over the next 3 yrs. We'll have only a few budgetary changes in 2024 for the conference.

Jennifer Swann, the Conference Lay leader, asked us lay delegates 3 questions:

- 1. What are our hopes and dreams for the church?
  - Answer: To be the church where all persons can experience and participle unconditionally in the body of Christ. Dream Big! Unity, inclusion, reconciliation, and diversity.
- 2. What are the essential functions of the conference?
  - Answer: Lead in a spirit of hope; make sure that none of our UMC members are left behind due to disaffiliation in some areas.
- 3. How can laity rise up and develop more lay leaders?
  - Answer: Support and train young people to be in ministry and partners with our clergy and not just sit back; support our clergy; connect lay people and pastors across the conference.

As BUMC members, we ask that you think about these questions. Many reports were given from committees. We saw broadcasts of ministers/deacons retiring and new deacons that were going to be ordained, which were very inspiring. Serving our Lord was their focus. An artist created an illustration on the theme of "Hope," and the altar of the conference was auctioned off. The couple who won it graciously presented it as a gift to our bishop! Thursday night we celebrated ordination for those entering the ministry. Our own Rev. Megan Twyman's mother-in-law was ordained as a deacon.

On the final day, delegates approved a petition to create an "LGBTQIA+ Ministries Team" to help local United Methodist Churches minister to the LGBTQIA+ community.
