The Mighty Oak Tree and Humble Reed

There's a fable about the Mighty Oak Tree and a Humble Reed growing side by side on a river's edge. From time to time they spoke to each other, but they were not close friends. They weren't close because the Mighty Oak considered himself superior to the Humble Reed. One day the oak said to the reed, "Look at you! You have no pride. You bend and bow to the slightest breeze. You should be more dignified like I am. You should stand strong as I do. Nothing can make me stoop or lower myself. But look at you! How weak you are."

Just then a fierce storm broke loose. Lightning flashed and strong winds howled. The oak stood firm for a short while, but his very stiffness became his undoing. The storm struck hard against the oak tree...tore his branches, broke his largest limbs, and toppled him into the river.

Meanwhile, the reed swayed and bent, letting the wind blow over him, but he did not break. And when the storm passed, he sprang back and was still growing beside the river's edge!

The point is clear: when change comes, it makes sense going with the flow – the winds of change will diminish and the sun will break through again, putting everything into focus.

People have all resisted change. None of us are pleased with face masks, keeping our distance, all the uncertainty...and we are growing weary of others' complaints – and our own – about it! We resist change personally and we resist it in our institutions. Abram had to deal with it. Jesus had to deal with it.

The important thing to remember is that while all is changing around us... the spirit, the truth and the ministry of God do not change. "We have this treasure in clay jars." The vessels are not what are important... it is the treasure that is within. So often, we focus on the vessels – on the structure, the buildings, the programs... I believe that we are in a time in the life of the church where we need to look at the treasure – the life that is given by God.

Here's your challenge: daily, consciously cultivate a spirit of gratitude. Find your blessings – anything you're thankful for – and give thanks to God. Express why you're grateful to loved ones or friends or co-workers.


Children and Youth
