The Governance Board met on Sunday, July 16. Rev. Hugh Debo spoke to the Board about his volunteer work for our church. Hugh is a relatively new member of our church, and is a retired Deacon. He has volunteered to take on the responsibility of member outreach with a focus on older members of our congregation. As part of this process, he has researched our membership, and shared some very interesting statistics about our older members:

- BUMC has 85 members that are 85 years old or older
- We have 50 members that are 90 years old or older
- And we have 30 members who are 95 years old or older!!

These members are an important part of our church family. Rev. Debo would like to build a team that would help with outreach to this group to keep them connected and involved. He has visited several Sunday School classes to inform them of this project. If this is an area for which you would like to volunteer, please reach out to Rev. Our financial reports through June show that our giving is down over last year at this time, and we are slightly over budget on expenses. We are at the halfway point in the year, so the Board will continue to closely monitor our month to month results, and make spending adjustments as needed. We have had gifts toward several capital improvements to our facilities and these are in progress as planned.

Rev. Price updated the Board with an organization chart that has clarified areas of responsibility for church administration. He also reported that annual staff evaluations have been completed.

- September 8-9, Nanih Chito Mission Project (installing new roofing)
- Bishop Delores Williamston will be at BUMC preaching on October 8

And lastly, we have received 4 new members at BUMC during June and July.

August Mission Focus: UMCOR (United Methodist Committee on Relief) Sager-Brown Depot Flood Bucket Cleaning Kits

The August Mission Focus is for providing the supplies to fill flood buckets for the UMCOR Sager-Brown Depot in Baldwin, Louisiana. UMCOR assists victims of natural and man-made disasters all over the world. Their warehouse collects cleaning, hygiene, and school kits for distribution in the United States. These supplies help the most vulnerable in the aftermath of a disaster. In preparation for the 2023 hurricane season, Sager-Brown needs your help to

assemble additional cleaning kits to replenish their supply.
