PROJECTS

There are a number of new projects and improvements in the works at BUMC.

- Replacement of electronic sign on Youree Drive
- New equipment and curriculum material for ELC and Day School
- Work to maintain and resurface the fellowship area stairway
- Replacement of carpet in Youth area located in Anderson Hall basement

These items will be funded by a grant that was recently awarded to BUMC.

Other upcoming work includes landscaping around the property thanks to a donation from a generous BUMC member. This work will include areas around the sign on Youree Drive, at the front under the steeple, and on the east side around the main entrance.

The ongoing air-handler replacement for the HVAC system in Anderson Hall is nearing completion with expected installation during the week of August 9th.

Stewardship

Our next Stewardship Campaign is scheduled to kick off in January 2022. The campaign will invite commitments and estimates of giving at the first of the year, rather than in the Fall, when we have historically held these generosity planning efforts. It is believed that this shift in timing from the fall to the beginning of the year can offer several benefits. Most people have a better understanding of anticipated income and cost of living adjustments at the beginning of the year. This can minimize some uncertainties that influence estimates of giving. The Fall can also be a busy time full of activities and holiday events. Holding the campaign at the beginning of the year can allow more focus for reflection and consideration of a renewed commitment to stewardship and increased generosity.

Faithful BOLD

As of early August, the Faithful BOLD Campaign has reduced the BUMC indebtedness to \$59,408.

WHICH OPTION IS FOR YOU?

Disrupted and erratic schedules can get in the way of our best intentions. This is an important reason that we suggest various options for recurring giving to the church. You can choose what works best for you.

- Direct Deposit, also known as Automated Clearing House payment (ACH) has been found to be most convenient and reliable for many of our participants. You complete an authorization form here at the church and we process your gift with your bank. You specify how much is drafted each month and to which fund/s you wish to give. You can adjust the arrangement at any time and there is no service fee from your bank.
- You can setup a recurring arrangement on your credit or debit card by going online to Broadmoor UMC.org and processing your gift under BUMC WEBSITE. Select "YES" when asked if you want this to be a recurring gift.
- You can TEXT-TO-GIVE by texting 'GIVEBUMC' followed by the amount you wish to give to 870-570-3715.

Recurring giving is faithful assurance that you're investing year-round in life changing ministry that happens all year long even when you are not able to be present. BEGINNING THE NEW TESTAMENT


Description: We will look at how the Old and New Testaments are similar and different. How do they teach us today?
