DOES THE CORONAVIRUS MEAN THAT JESUS IS **COMING BACK SOON?**

Actually, the Bible tells us we have been living in the last days ever since Jesus came into our world. Hebrews 1:1-2 reads, "Long ago God spoke to our ancestors in many and various ways by the prophets, but in these last days he has spoken to us by a Son." This means the last days began when God sent Jesus into the world. This means we have been living in the last days for the past two thousand years!

But Jesus also spoke about the signs that would point to his return. In Matthew 24 we read of wars and famines and plagues and natural disasters—Jesus says they are all signs pointing towards Christ's return.

Jesus said these signs are like birth pains. Well, what do we know about birth pains? At first, they are less severe and more spaced apart. But as the time gets nearer, they grow closer together and more intense. So, we can expect that as the time for Christ's return draws nearer, these signs will become more frequent and intense. So events like the coronavirus and wars and earthquakes and hurricanes - all could be pointing us towards Christ's return.

Will Christ return soon? We don't know. The birth pains may be more frequent and severe. It's necessary to remember that for "the Lord a day is like a thousand years, and a thousand years are like a day." What is soon for the Lord may still be far away for us.

Look, the biblical message is this: be ready. Walk the walk. That is far more important than knowing for sure when Christ will return.






Grand Gathering 2021

A Lesson in Being Enthusiastic

Generous Spirit; Peaceful Soul

In my streaming episode last Thursday at noon, I drew attention to the last half of the Prayer of St. Francis as a way to help direct our energies to a more generous and peaceful place. It is a petition to God.

O Divine Master,

Grant that I may not so much seek

To be consoled as to console;

To be understood as to understand;

To be loved as to love.

The request is for an unselfish spirit to not be personally consoled, understood, and loved until one is first a holy agent of Christ to console others, understand others, and to love others. Often it is difficult for us to do the things we think are really good ideas; we don't seem to be able to carry out our best intentions.

One writer A.J. Jacobs makes this suggestion – Fake it to you feel it. Force yourself to do what seems to be a good idea though you are not yet convinced. His conclusion, it is easier to act your way into a new way of thinking than it is to think yourself into a new way of acting.

Have you ever overcome your reluctance to start a new endeavor that you had contemplated for years, with a single step and then a second step, and then more, and first thing you know the undertaking becomes second nature to you? And, you say, why have I been so unwilling to give of myself.

I find many people who go to help at a homeless shelter or soup kitchen and come away with a whole new way of thinking about the need for their service and about those who are served.

The Prayer of St. Francis confirms for us the outcome of our efforts to live unselfishly.

For it is in giving that we receive;

It is in pardoning that we are pardoned;

And it is in dying that we are born to eternal life.

Free your reluctance to be a willing instrument of God's peace and enjoy the generous spirit God has for you.


