#### I remain in awe of Jesus.

#### Wall to be Rebuilt

During the wind event of Hurricane Laura, 135 feet of cinder block wall adjacent to the parking lot fell and collapsed. A similar failure happened to an adjoining section of wall in November, 2018. The decision was made at that time to erect a concrete wall for greater strength and longevity that matched the adjoining wall.

The Governance Board has approved the replacement of this section of wall in a similar fashion. Insurance does not cover this type of loss. Earnings from BUMC accounts in The United Methodist Foundation of Louisiana will be used to help defray the cost of the wall which will be \$ 30,000. Any assistance with this project will be greatly appreciated.
