



From Your Governance Board

The Governance Board meeting was held on Sunday September 18th at 4:00 PM in Pearce Hall. Several items of business were discussed as follows:

- Charge Conference will be Saturday October 15th and 10:00 AM at Christ UMC. This will be a Cluster
 Conference as several UMC churches will have their Charge Conference at the same time. All are invited to attend.

- The board discussed the need for various board members to serve as designees for different areas of the church, such as, youth, missions, disciples, and choir. The purpose of the designee is to make sure that the board is fully supporting those missions of the Church.
- The Strategic Plan was last updated in 2021 and was still a "pre-COVID" type model. The board is working towards a new Strategic plan starting in January or February of 2023. The strategic plan will encompass all aspects of the church with input from staff and laity members.
- Annual Roster Purge will occur the beginning of October. This is a process where members of the church that have not attend a service or event in the last 3 years will be removed from the rosters of the church if they do not wish to remain on the rolls, or have 3 years of no contact with the chruch. If you receive a postcard in the mail, it is important that you respond so that the church can have an accurate roster.
- Rev. Terry Love stated that BUMC is in good financial shape as of 8/31/22. Highlights include that the church's Revenue currently \$6,776 ahead of budget through August. Expenses are up 3.5%; however, we are still on track to finish within budget.
- Rev. Love also requested that the Committee review bids on upgrading the internet service at the church. Due to poor bandwidth with the current provider, both services have reported multiple outages with the Livestream. The Board passed a motion for Rev. Love to continue negotiations with the service providers, with budget not to exceed \$400 per month. Once a provider is selected, it should take 60 days for the equipment to be installed and for internet performance to improve.



These carry over funds, plus anticipated pledged donations, have been a supportive influence for existing programming. They have been insufficient to allow for budgeting of needed increases in staff compensation to keep up with inflation and expand ministry initiatives. This opportunity is for each of us to stretch our imaginations of how God can affect individual spiritual renewal through a time of personal appraisal and reawakened dedication. When we put our hope in God's provision, we can rest assured that God will provide for our needs.

of the many outdoor or indoor restaurants, or bring a sack lunch for a picnic.



This course comes highly recommended for all lay leaders serving or considering serving in administrative roles, speaking roles, leading mission, prayer, care teams, or teaching.


